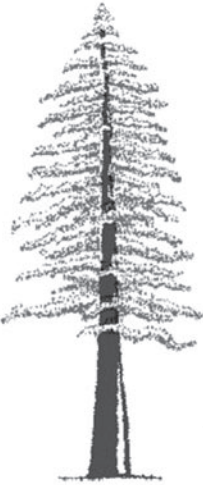

ABOUT THE MUSIC

Many equate American music with patriotic songs such as "America" and the "Star-spangled Banner", but American music is as widely varied and energetic as the people who have lived in the United States for the last 250 years.

William Billings, born 10 years before Mozart, was not much to look at. According to John Lienhard, "He was blind in one eye with a short leg and a withered arm...and he was hopelessly addicted to tobacco," but he is widely



regarded as our first popular American composer. As an intense supporter of the American Revolution he was dedicated to writing non-European music. He intentionally avoided European styles in the many tunes he wrote dedicated to the war effort, including our first, unofficial national anthem, "Chester."

Stephen Foster, born in the 19th century, wrote music for the growing country which is still an important part of our psyche; songs such as "Camptown Races", "Oh, Susanna", and our featured pieces "Some Folks" and "Nelly Bly".

Two composers, Randall Thompson and Aaron Copland, brought American music to the world stage. The choir will present three pieces from Randall Thompson's beloved "Frostiana". The settings of Robert Frost's poems were written in 1959 to commemorate the bicentennial of the town of Amherst, MA, the hometown of Frost and many other American writers.

The music of Aaron Copland has attracted many imitators in the decades since it was written. Snatches from his ballets, "Rodeo" and "Appalachian Spring" can be heard in television commercials today, while "Fanfare for the Common Man" will always be associated with the Olympics. Copland's own love of American folk music contributed to America's renewed interest in its great musical storehouse. The choir will present three of these delightful pieces: "The Boatmen's Dance", which evokes 19th century workmen; the clever "I Bought Me a Cat"; and the moving spiritual song "Zion's Walls".

We are excited to present two contemporary composers. Eric Whitacre is a rising star in American choral music, and "Cloudburst" exemplifies his new, creative style. We are thrilled to sing an arrangement of "On the Street Where You Live" from *My Fair Lady* by our own Dr. Kirby Shaw. Dr. Shaw, a Rogue Valley resident, is internationally known for his musical compositions and arrangements.

The program will conclude with popular pieces which have become classics in their own right. Music of *Tin Pan Alley* by Cole Porter and Jerome Kern will tug at the heart-strings. Spirituals arranged by the great Moses Hogan will touch the spirit. And "Make Our Garden Grow" from *Candide* by Leonard Bernstein will speak to our collective view of a true American life.

BIOGRAPHIES

MARK REPERT - Music Director



Mark Reppert studied conducting, composition, piano and music history at University of Southern California, graduating with a degree in Music History. While there, he was a member of the University Symphony, the Opera Chorus and the Trojan Marching Band. He received a master's degree in piano performance from Cal State University, Chico, graduating with distinction.

Mr. Reppert began his teaching career in 1975 at Paradise Intermediate School in Paradise, California. He taught for 23 years in California, teaching all manner of music from kindergarten to college, including band, orchestra, elementary music, college music appreciation, community choir, and high school and middle school choir. He recently retired from the position of choral director at North Medford High School after 10 years.

Mr. Reppert is now an active musician in the Rogue Valley. He was musical director for recent productions of *Cabaret* and *Secret Garden* at Camelot Theatre. Additionally, he has worked as a singer and accompanist for the Rogue Valley Chorale. He has also accompanied the Jefferson State Choral Coalition, under the direction of Kirby Shaw and works as a musician in many other capacities around the Valley. This fall, Mr. Reppert will begin his second season as director of the Siskiyou Singers.

JOSEPH YUNGEN - Accompanist

Joseph Yungen has been the resident accompanist for the Siskiyou Singers for close to six years. This is his last series of concerts with the choir, as he will graduate from Southern Oregon University this spring as a piano performance major. He is to attend the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York in the fall, working on two Master of Music degrees, in Piano Performance & Literature and in Accompanying/Chamber Music. Joseph is featured in this program with his performance of a work by the American composer, William Bolcolm, "The Serpent's Kiss" from *The Garden of Eden*.



Originally from eastern Oregon, Joseph began his piano studies at age four. In 2007 he was selected winner of the Young Artists' Piano Concerto Competition for his performance of Prokofiev's Piano Concerto No. 5. He also competed as a finalist in the First Seattle International Piano Competition in September of 2008, where he received two prizes: "Best Performance of a Piece by Karol Szymanowski", and the "Audience Favorite" award. In 2009 Joseph traveled to Chengdu, China to participate in the Chinese-American International Piano Institute at the Sichuan Conservatory.

He has performed with numerous soloists and ensembles, as well as premiered works for modern composers and for the National Association of Composers. Joseph is a recipient of the Chamber Music Concerts Charter Donor Scholarship and currently studies with Dr. Alexander Tutunov at Southern Oregon University.

Hal Davis has spent most of his life involved in music studies, teaching, and performance, on both a semi-professional and professional level. Over the last couple of decades, that has included the Principal Percussion chair with the Rogue Valley Symphony Orchestra, substitute Principal Percussionist with the North State Symphony Orchestra, timpanist with the Jefferson State Baroque Orchestra, drums/percussion in three summer shows at the Oregon Cabaret Theater, work with the Camelot Theater, the Siskiyou Singers, the Jefferson State Choral Coalition, College of the Siskiyous Summer Choir Camp, various jazz, blues, and rock gigs, plus teaching private drum/percussion lessons and tutoring several public school percussion sections in the Rogue Valley.

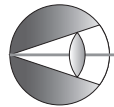

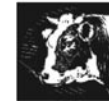

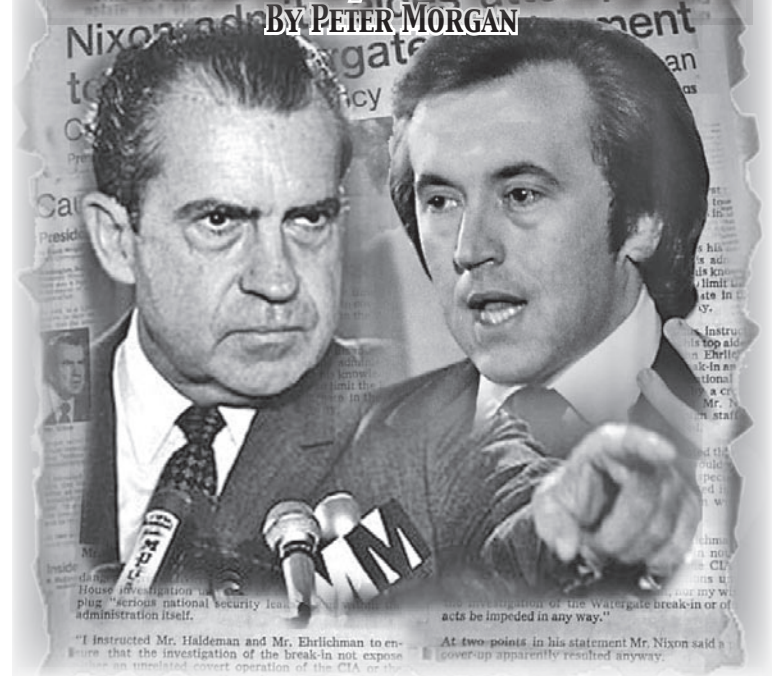
